

Its historic district is filled with cobblestoned squares and parks such as Forsyth Park shaded by oak trees covered with Spanish moss. At the center of this picturesque district is the landmark, Gothic-Revival Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist.

Its cobblestone streets, horse-drawn carriages and pastel antebellum houses, particularly in the elegant French Quarter and Battery districts, define Charleston, the South Carolina port city founded in 1670. The Battery promenade and Waterfront Park both overlook Charleston Harbor, while Fort Sumter, a federal stronghold where the first shots of the Civil War rang out, lies across the water.

Explore Native American History And The Grand Canyon

Native Americans have inhabited what is now <u>Arizona</u> for thousands of years. It remains a state with one of the largest percentages of <u>Native Americans</u> in the <u>United States</u>, and has the second largest total Native American population of any state. In addition, the majority of the <u>Navajo Nation</u>, the largest Native American reservation in the US, and the entire <u>Tohono O'odham Nation</u>, the second largest, are located in Arizona. Over a quarter of the area of the state is reservation land.

Grand Canyon National Park, located in northwestern Arizona, is the 15th site in the United States to have been named a <u>national park</u>. The park's central feature is the <u>Grand Canyon</u>, a <u>gorge</u> of the <u>Colorado River</u>, which is often considered one of the <u>Wonders of the World</u>. The park, which covers 1,217,262 acres (1,901.972 sq mi; 4,926.08 km²), received more than six million recreational visitors in 2017, which is the second highest count of all American national parks. The Grand Canyon was designated a <u>World Heritage Site</u> by <u>UNESCO</u> in 1979. The park celebrated its 100th anniversary on February 26, 2019.

In 1873, Kansas Sate helped pioneer the academic teaching of home economics for women, becoming one of the first two U.S. colleges to offer the program of study.

Day 2: Kansas: There's No Place Like Home—get a late morning start (brunch on your own) with a short trip to Wamego, KS, for a tour of the refurbished Columbian Theatre, an "unforgettable jewel of the Kansas prairie," home to many art pieces from the 1893 Columbian Exposition. You will have a bit of time to explore the Main Street district, home to one of the largest private collections of memorabilia at the Wizard of Oz Museum. Complete the day with a relaxing visit and dinner hosted by local colleagues.

Day 3: Start the day with breakfast on your own at the hotel, then take a short trip to Justin Hall, home to the K-State College of Health and Human Sciences for an update on current faculty research. Enjoy lunch on your own in Aggieville, before a short trip to Junction City High School--learn about the school curriculum redesign efforts and tour the facility, including FCS classrooms. Complete the day with a look at global perspectives and the work of People to People International at the Eisenhower Presidential Library, with insights from Mary Eisenhower, granddaughter of President Dwight D. Eisenhower. A catered dinner is provided.

Day 4: Start the day with breakfast on your own at the hotel, then take a short trip to Justin Hall, home to the K-State College of Health and Human Sciences for more updates on current faculty research. Learn about global food/feed the future programs at the <u>Biosecurity Research Institute (BRI)</u>, with a **catered lunch** and lecture. Focusing on the life course perspective, tour and learn about the Claflin Child and Family Resource Center; return to the hotel for a short respite, before a relaxing evening at the <u>Liquid Arts Winery</u>.
